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### English Peer Review

Though memo describes the situation that has lead to the need of more education, but it is silent on the purpose of the memo in the first or second sentence, like advising school administrators to think of ways of improving online classes and incorporating evening classes, as a way of ensuring that students are in a position of actively engaging in other activities that supports their families. This is included to ensure that the reader is in a position of identifying what the memo contains, and stand of the author at the beginning, and to whom the memo is intended to (Markel 2007). So, this statement should be added to the introduction.

One to improve problem definition is by adding some factors contributing to the problem. The problem is limited evening courses as a result of few teachers, leading to inadequate abilities to support evening program. This situation has been accelerated by improper curriculum implementation, paying less attention to the evening classes.

On the other hand, one way to improve solution is ensuring that all factors contributing to the problem are dealt with. For instance, in this case, though those who are tech savvy are negatively affected, the solution could have been, 'simplifying the level of technology required in study by the school IT departments could help students that are not tech savvy and have tight programs to continue studying.

Ethos arguments are statements creating impression that one is worthy being listened to. In this case, they include statements like, when the author is introducing herself as 'As a working mother, and a student at North Seattle Community College'.

Pathos is emotion appeals used in persuading, including statements like those in paragraph two, when the author is explaining about spending quality time with children and taking them to their medical appointments. They are also in the second last paragraph, when explaining about being sympathetic to students.

Logos implies to persuasion through reasoning. They are found in paragraph 3, where the author uses statistics to prove that students need to be active in workplace to support their families, proving the advantages of evening classes. They are also found in paragraph 4, when discussing the best way to improve living standards of middle class.

The author should also come up with statistics indicating how many students are willing to attend online classes or evening classes but lack the opportunity of doing so. This will very important to decision makers especially in weighing the feasibility of the program.

Additionally, the size of the introduction is too small as compared to the document, so, the author should add some more relevant words in the introduction.
